Hrólfur Karl Cela from Basalt Architects is the first speaker of the "Earth Homing" public program. For his talk entitled "Earth Homing Architecture" Hrólfur will present his most recent projects including the new Blue Lagoon Hotel and Spa in Svartsengi, Grindavík as well as imperative concepts such as nature, sustainability or earth architecture.

Hrólfur Karl Cela, born in Reykjavík, Iceland is an architect and partner in Reykjavík Architecture Studio, Basalt Architects. Hrólfur studied architecture at the Iceland Academy for the Arts and at Parsons, the New School for Design in Manhattan, New York. Later he completed a teaching degree from the Iceland Academy for the Arts as well as studying Environmental Ethics at the University of Iceland. Basalt Architect's projects are known for their interpretation of contemporary architecture and their sensitivity to natural context.
